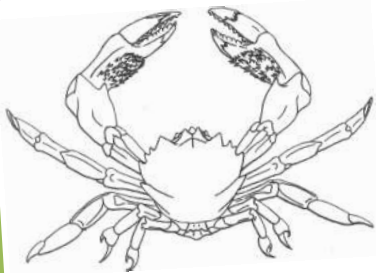


MEMORY GAME

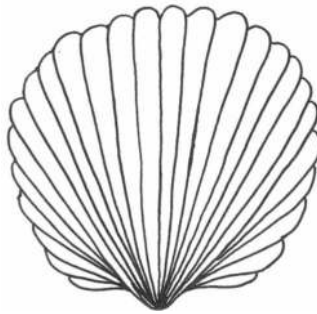
You can play with a friend or challenge your own memory by playing alone.

RULES

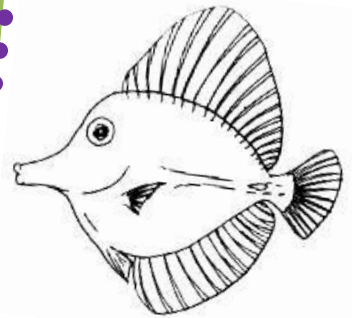
1. Mix up the cards.

9. The player with the most matches wins.



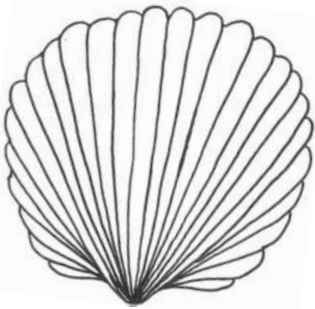
